What We're Learning

Language Arts:

- Fluently recognizing letters and producing their sounds
- Phonemic Awareness Skills- Reference handout from curriculum night or class website
- Understanding the purpose of the author and illustrator and the basic differences between fiction and non-fiction
- Labeling our pictures with letters, words, and sentences

Math:

We will review Unit I next week

- Counting to 20 from any given number
- Counting up to 20 objects
- Identifying and writing the value of the penny and nickel
- Ordinal numbers lst-5th
- Interpreting a picture graph by explaining more and less

Science:

- Explaining that FORCE is a PUSH or PULL that causes MOTION, and MOTION is MOVEMENT.
- Explaining the types of movement caused by force
 - straight, zig zag, curved, circular, fast and slow, motionless, back and forth

Handwriting:

- Aa, Tt, Mm, Nn, Pp, Rr, Cc, Ss
- Writing numbers 0-20
 - Please note: This is an ongoing skill for the year.

This week we played around with force, and learned that a push or a pull can cause different types of motion. Next week we will review and wrap up unit I in math, and while we will continue to build on standards from unit one in class, it is important that you also review these skills with your child. The Math Night handout had some fun ideas for review.
